

# **New Zealand guidelines for cataloguing electronic serials on the NBD**

These guidelines are designed to help you create and edit bibliographic records and holdings for serial electronic resources on the National Bibliographic Database (NBD), whether they are added by batch load or manually. They are intended to be applied alongside existing cataloguing standards for electronic resources, as outlined in AACR2 (2nd edition, 2002 revision) and the CONSER (CCM) Cataloguing Manual, 2004 edition. We wish to acknowledge the National Library of Australia whose guidelines were used as a reference point for the development of this document.

## **Why include records for e-serials in the NBD?**

Te Puna encourages libraries to record their electronic serials on the NBD, even if the resource is not available for interloan. The benefits include:

- Improved access for end users
- Improved workflows for cataloguing, reference and interloan librarians
- An improved NBD as a tool for resource sharing between libraries

## **How can records for e-serials be added to the NBD?**

- They can be batch loaded from your online catalogue, your weblist, or from your provider datafiles.
- They can be manually added onto the NBD

## **Key cataloguing recommendations**

### **1. Single or separate records**

You may provide records according to either:

- A. A separate record approach (CCM 31.2.5B)**  
A separate bibliographic record should be provided on Te Puna for both the print publication and the online resource. Cataloguers should use one bibliographic record for all iterations of an online version of a serial, regardless of aggregator or other supplier.
- B. A single record approach (CCM 31.2.5A)**  
A single record is valid when the online version is an equivalent manifestation of the original version. Indicate the existence and location of the online version(s) in the record for the original serial.

The separate record approach is favoured at the NBD level because:

- Separate records are easier to maintain on the NBD when batch loading
- Libraries can still use a single record in their own library catalogue.  
It is easier to merge separate records rather than to split merged records.
- Current international standards support this approach

## 2. Cataloguing considerations

- *Do separate records exist for both the electronic and print form?*  
If yes, add an 'Additional physical form available' linking note (MARC field 530) in both bibliographic records to indicate the existence of the alternative form.  
Also, add 776 (Additional physical form entry) linking fields between each record (print and electronic) ([see Appendix 2, examples 2a and 2b](#))
- *Does the online version have significant additional content not present in the original print version?*  
If yes, separate records are preferred ([see Appendix 2, examples 3a and 3b](#))
- *Would your library prefer to use a single record covering all versions in your own online catalogue?*  
In these cases include an 'Additional physical form available' linking note (MARC field 530) to the record for the print form to indicate the existence of the electronic form. Electronic location and access information (MARC field 856) should also be added ([see Appendix 2 Example 1](#))
  - Do not create merged records by the addition of the full details of the electronic form to the record for the print form

The standards for bibliographic and holdings data for e-resources are evolving and the interpretation of standards may vary between organisations. It is to be expected that there may be some differences in the application of standards in records that are added to the NBD for the foreseeable future. Any changes in the international standards will be considered as part of any further development of these guidelines.

### 3. Electronic location and access

#### a) Access via bibliographic record

##### 856 Electronic location and access

This field contains the URL and other details required to locate and access the resource. Most records require an 856 for the URL address and some may require extra 856 fields to indicate other access options such as email, ftp, etc. It is recommended that persistent identifiers be used in NBD records where available (for example PURLs, DOIs).

When the title is available from a number of locations, add a note (z subfield) to each 856 so that each version can easily be distinguished. Use appropriate text for each note, for example: Publisher site, Archived at ATL. Give preference to the publisher's URL as this is usually more up-to-date than the archived version.

**Email addresses** may be recorded in field 856 but they can be fragmented in their structure making it difficult to click on or copy and paste the addresses. Consider placing email addresses that are relevant to the item (for example, email subscription information) in the 538 field, in addition to the 856 field. See [MARC 21 format for bibliographic data](#) for more details.

NB: The 856 field information will not be regularly checked by Te Puna for currency.

#### b) Holdings record

Holdings belong within a holdings record and not within the bibliographic record itself. It is recommended that a holdings record is always created for electronic copies and attached to the bibliographic record for the electronic version (if one exists). Holdings which are bulk loaded will be added to e-version records. The holdings record will indicate:

- the library that has subscription to the title
- what access it has (e.g. Electronic resource, Freely available on Internet)
- when it is not available for interloan
- when it is available for interloan but may have restrictions

##### 852 Holdings statement

This field will be constructed as follows, using the MARC subfields tags that are available on Te Puna.

852 # # |b Library symbol |h Access details |z Notes on interloan availability |z Other restrictions.

## 852 Interloan availability

It is recommended that libraries add holdings even when an electronic publication is not available for interloan.

- If the item is available for interloan, no holding availability statement is required.
- If interloan availability is restricted (e.g. embargoes, licence agreements), or not allowed, use one of the following holdings statements:
  - Not available for interloan
  - Available for interloan – restrictions may apply

- If using WebCat, it is necessary to use the holdings note field, which will be stored in the 866z field (as a note can not be displayed in the 852)

## 852 Free resources

No holding record is necessary for freely available titles, as the access is available via the 856 field on the bibliographic record.

However, you can add the following statement if you wish:

852 # # |bWN |h Freely available on Internet

## 856 Links to publication

Optionally use in the holdings record when pointing to an "archive version" held by your library, for a holdings link to your library catalogue, or for a link to the resource that is specifically for your own library users. (The MARC 856 field in the bibliographic record will record general links to the resource.)

## 866 Range of dates

It is recommended that where possible, details of the actual serial issues held be included in the holdings statement

## **4. Maintenance**

As with all bibliographic and holdings records added to the NBD, users are strongly encouraged to update bibliographic records for electronic resources when there are changes to the publication or to a library's holdings.

### **Amend records when:**

1. **The resource ceases but all or some issues are still available**  
Many electronic resources, both serials and non-serials, continue to change over time. As with printed serials, multi-volume and loose-leaf works, it is necessary to close the record when the title ceases to be updated.
2. **A publication changes its title**  
Add links to each record.
3. **Internet resource ceases**  
If an electronic resource ceases to exist, the bibliographic record for the resource should be retained on Te Puna and a note should be added to indicate this. The 856 field should be removed as its primary purpose is to provide a direct link to the resource. The URL should be retained within a note only, as this could be useful if the publication was to restart.
4. **A publication is removed from an aggregator's database**  
Delete the 856 for the aggregator from the record.

## **Appendix 1. Recommended Data Elements for bibliographic record**

This appendix lists data elements that would usually be included in bibliographic records for serial electronic resources. It is not intended to be a complete list of the data elements that may be required. For more details about these and other data elements please consult the *MARC 21 format for bibliographic data* and CONSER Cataloguing Manual Module 31 ( <http://www.loc.gov/acq/conser/Module31.pdf> ).

### **Leader 06 (Type of record)**

The Type of record code (Leader/06) in records for electronic resources should be coded to convey the most significant aspect of the work. Resources that are primarily text, such as electronic journals and books, should be coded "a" (Language material). If the electronic resource is a picture, the appropriate code would be code "k" (Two dimensional non-projectable graphic) and for a map use code "e" (Cartographic material).

Code "m" is only used for the following classes of electronic resources: computer software (including programs, games, fonts); numeric data; computer-oriented multimedia; online systems or services.

### **Leader 07 (Bibliographic level)**

The bibliographic level code (Leader/07) in records for electronic resources should be coded to convey either the serial or monographic nature of the item described.

To determine if a resource should be coded as a monograph or a serial, consider:

- is it issued in successive parts bearing numeric or chronological designations or organised into designated parts for ease of use? Treat it as a **serial**
- or is it added to or changed by means of updates that do not remain discrete and are integrated into the whole? Treat it as a **monograph** (at present).

The implementation of the new code 'i' for integrating resources is currently under negotiation at the Library of Congress and should not be used until further notice.

### **Field 006 (Fixed length data elements – additional material characteristics)**

Unless Leader/06 is coded 'm' it is necessary to include field 006 to describe the electronic aspects of the resource. For textual electronic resources the Computer file type subfield (006/09) will usually be coded "d" (Document). Code "m" should be used when the item is a combination of two or more types of files, eg text with a significant amount of multimedia files.

**Field 007 (Physical description fixed field – general information)**

The computer file 007 should be used in any record representing an item whose carrier is a computer file. For an online electronic resource the Specific Material Designation subfield (007/01) should be coded "r" (Remote).

**Field 008 (Fixed length data elements – general information)**

Use the 008 fixed fields that are appropriate to the type of record indicated in Leader/06.

Many non-serial online titles are not complete and are continually updated, if this is the case, the Type of Date/Publication Status subfield (008/06) should be coded "m" (Multiple dates).

Internet serial publications often lack a definable frequency, with information being constantly updated and changed. If this is the case, the Frequency subfield (008/18) should be coded "blank" (No determinable frequency) and the Regularity subfield (008/19) should be coded "x" (Completely irregular).

**008/23 or 008/29 (Form of Item)**

The form of item code for electronic resources is code "s" (Electronic).

**022 (ISSN)**

Enter the ISSN in the "a" subfield for item being catalogued, as well as ISSN for alternative version in the "y" subfield (i.e. add print ISSN to "y" subfield of electronic record and vice versa)

**130 (Main Entry - Uniform Title)**

Consider adding a uniform title if the electronic resource is also available in other formats or in other versions.

**245 subfield h (General material designation)**

The general material designation "[electronic resource]" should be used.

**300 (Physical description)**

Records for remote access electronic resources should not include a 300 field as there is no physical item.

**500 (General notes)**

A number of general notes may be required, including recognition of the source of title proper other general notes and explanation of updating procedures.

**1. Source of title proper**

This note should always be included in a record for an electronic resource even when the title is taken from the chief source of information. Always indicate the date on which the title was viewed for cataloguing.

**2. Other general notes**

Give other general notes to explain expected changes/updates that may be provided by the publisher/editor.

**530 (Additional physical form available note)**

If the cataloguer is aware that a resource exists in both electronic and non-electronic form, it is recommended that an 'Additional physical form available' linking note (MARC field 530) be included in the bibliographic records for both versions to indicate the existence of the alternative form.

**538 (System details note)**

This note records system information. It should be provided to explain any special access requirements such as browser plug-ins.

**6XX (Subjects)**

There are NO form headings for online publications.

**710 /730 (Added entries : corporate name; uniform title)**

Do not make added entries for the name of aggregator or provider

**776 (Additional physical form entry)**

Add linking fields between each record (print and electronic)

**856 (Links to publication)**

Add URLs and other details required to locate and access the resource.

Use general URLs, rather than institution specific URLs. Prefer persistent URLs (PURLs) where available. See 3. Electronic location and access a) Access via bibliographic record.

## **Appendix 2. Examples of records of online serial titles on NBD**

The following examples illustrate the use of the linking fields and the 856 fields. The following New Zealand examples illustrate the inconsistencies that can exist between online and print serials.
