

WHAT IS THE NEW ZEALAND NATIONAL BIBLIOGRAPHY?

The New Zealand National Bibliography (NZNB) is a list of publications from or about New Zealand. It provides a record of New Zealand's publishing activities and thus is a reflection of the social, cultural and scientific endeavours of the country.

NZNB is used as a reference source, as a source of information for purchasing New Zealand publications and as a source of cataloguing information.

Much of the material included in the NZNB has been acquired by the National Library of New Zealand through the legal deposit provisions of the National Library Act. Published books, serials, newspapers, maps, prints, posters and calendars are acquired by the National Library and made available for future generations. The NZNB lists these items, as well as other New Zealand items that have been donated to or purchased by the library, including non-print materials such as sound recordings and CD-ROMs.

- You can access NZNB records via the National Bibliographic database, which is updated daily and available by subscription
- You can access the NZNB (Monthly), which is available free of charge via the National Library's web site <http://www.natlib.govt.nz>
